### **NORTHEAST**

1. NE2004424 – International Fisheries Trade Permit (IFTP) Holder Grand Sea Boston LLC was charged under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Magnuson-Stevens Act) with submitting inaccurate information and importing sea cucumbers without a valid IFTP. A \$20,750 NOVA was issued.

2. PI2202188; F/V Golden Eagle – Crewmember Jessie Tabios Turqueza was charged under the Magnuson-Stevens Act with sexual harassment of an observer. An \$18,000 NOVA was issued.

#### **SOUTHEAST**

3. SE2203060; F/V Gulf Offshore – Owner/Operator John William Fagan was charged under the Magnuson-Stevens Act with fishing for or possessing Gulf reef fish on a charter trip with an expired Gulf reef fish charter permit. A \$5,000.00 NOVA was issued.

A \$38,658.15 NOVA was issued, and the case settled for \$29,500. [See Charged Cases, Item 5, fro October 2022 report.]
