Good afternoon,

As most of you are aware, Dorian is now a major hurricane (Cat 3 with max winds of 115 mph) and will be approaching the southeast/east central coast of the Florida peninsula in the coming days. The current forecast track from the [National Hurricane Center](#) brings the center of the hurricane onshore sometime Tuesday morning. Forecast projections continue to indicate that a sharp turn to the northwest and north along or near the east coast of Florida, Georgia and the Carolinas.

Of course, these forecast trends can change and there is still some risk for Dorian to progress further west before turning north which could influence impacts in the southeast region. However, the eventual track of Dorian through Florida and beyond is still several days away. Thus, no impacts are expected at this time for north Alabama or southern middle Tennessee during the next 5-7 days if at all. In fact, the next 5-7 days will remain mostly dry and seasonably hot, with just a slight chance of a thunderstorm on Wednesday.

With this in mind, unless large changes in the forecast occur, we will not be sending further updates over the holiday weekend.
