Hi Amanda,

Here are the sentences that Naseem flagged to be updated with info from the Spring-run Action Plan along with her comments.

1. The resulting returns in 2016 and 2017, were very low (1,659 and 691 respectively), as was the 2018 returns.
Naseem: Doesn't cover the years after finalized. Use the spring-run action plan – check with Amanda.
2. In summary, the extinction risk for the CV spring-run Chinook salmon ESU remains at moderate risk of extinction (NMFS 2016b). However, based on the severity of the drought and the low escapements, as well as increased pre-spawn mortality in Butte, Mill, and Deer creeks in 2015, there is concern that these CV spring-run Chinook salmon strongholds will deteriorate into high extinction risk in the coming years based on the population size or rate of decline criteria (NMFS 2016b).
Naseem: Several more years of data/info – add action plan
3. Currently, many of the PBFs of CV spring-run Chinook salmon critical habitat are degraded and provide limited high-quality habitat. Factors that lessen the quality of migratory corridors for juveniles include unscreened or inadequately screened diversions, altered flows in the Delta, scarcity of complex in-river cover, and the lack of floodplain habitat.
Naseem: Add some from action plan? Flows and temperatures in tribs?
