For example, is there recent information or science to support the proposed Shasta Summer Cold Water Temperature Management; proposed changes to OMR, removing I:E, HORB or Georgiana Slough Barriers from the Proposed Action. Think back to our "gap" analysis review of the draft proposed action during the tiger team meetings.
