You bet. All of the SJR basin fish will feel the effects of exports by either going by the "front door" of the exports via the Old River route since the PA has no HORB in place to block that route or via the backdoor from the mainstem SJR if they stay in the SJR mainstem at the Head of Old River and then get advected towards the pumps due to tidal forcing into the northern sections of Old River, Middle River, Columbia Cut or Turner Cut. Any fish that goes the Old River route from the Head of Old River will more than likely never get north of the pumps, but will either get entrained into the TFCF or CCF or predated upon trying to migrate north past the pumps. Fish in the mainstem SJR have a chance to stay in the mainstem and make it to Chipps Island.
