These canneries had discharges of effluent that were high in biological or chemical oxygen demand. Mr. Renning's suggestion makes sense, as the SWRCB noted in D-1422 that the then-applicable water quality control plan included a requirement in the Stanislaus River for DO "as a result of waste discharges..." (D-1422, p. 12).
