## My comments on top of Garwin's

1 main point for consideration: I think that failing to meet BOTH the TDM and ETF in a tier should shift consideration/classification of that year into the next higher tier. So if Reclamation is operating to tier 1 but fails at the TDM and ETF metrics, that year would 'count' as a tier 2&3 year (or tier 4 in extreme cases). If, doing so would exceed the expected 1/4 years at tier 2&3 (or 1/10 for tier 4) then we would reinitate.
