I was under the impression that even in wet years the WT task group was in close coordination to make sure there was enough cold water to minimize impacts during the whole egg incubation season.

Even in wet years, the cold water pool in Shasta Reservoir must be carefully managed to provide protective water temperatures for winter-run Chinook salmon eggs and fry on the valley floor throughout the summer and early fall. [MCR1]
